

Code of Conduct

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to provide guidelines for how individuals are expected to function as members of Pensacola Roller Gurlz (PRG). All members of PRG assume an obligation to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with the PRG mission and the WFTDA Code of Conduct. When an individual competes in any PRG event, they indicate an understanding and agreement to represent PRG in a manner that does not detract from the image of the league. Furthermore, individuals should display sports like behavior and abide by the rules, regulations, policies, and procedures.

Addressing Issues and Concerns

Any issues or concerns any individual may have should be brought to the Grievance Committee. In the event of a dispute between members, the problem is to be resolved in such a manner as to not involve all members of PRG. If the dispute cannot be resolved in an appropriate manner, it is to be brought to the attention of a member of the Board. It is the Board member's responsibility to facilitate fair and equitable resolution of disputes and concerns through formation of a grievance committee.

Display Good Judgment

All members must remember that PRG is run as a business and all business information needs to remain confidential. All members must conduct business with honesty, fairness, and integrity. All members need to be conscious of PRG's image as it pertains to PRG as a business and their membership to PRG. All members must be aware of how they are representing PRG and how they conduct themselves at PRG events.

Treat all Members with Respect, Dignity, and Fairness

It is the responsibility of all members of PRG to treat one another, volunteers, fan, families, and venues with respect, dignity, and fairness. Respect, dignity, and fairness will be displayed in person and on all private and public forums. All members must ensure that any PRG event is free of harassment or abuse, and all procedures and policies are followed correctly. Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct will result in disciplinary behavior including but not limited to being asked to leave practices or events, being removed from rosters, and being asked to resign from the league. The Board of Directors will put disciplinary action forth only after a thorough discussion and unbiased hearing of the issue.

Practice/Scrimmage/Bout/Event Expectations

Skaters and referees must wear all gear during practices, scrimmages, and games. Members must abide to the Dreamland dress code; dress appropriately. During any PRG event (including practice, games, NSOing, parades, bull runs, car washes, etc.) on or off skates, one cannot be under the influence of any judgment altering substances at any time. Members must wear all gear (mouthguard optional) if participating on skates during an event in which they are participating with or representing PRG.
